Roger Eaton is expecting it to be available in the store by the end of February. It already has the goals of the UN built in, each as its own community making it a great tool for the nonprofit's SF UN Goals project.

B. PERSONAL NOTE

With a heavy heart, Roger Eaton informed the BOD that his wife passed away just a little before Thanksgiving this year. This is a sad time for Mr. Eaton and it is understood by the BOD that he should take the amount of time he deems necessary to mourn and process his next steps.

C. UNITED NATIONS ASSOCIATION - SAN FRANCISCO (UNA-SF) AND THE SAN FRANCISCO UN GOALS PROJECT

Roger Eaton has been attending the UNA-SF meetings. Once the App is available in the App store, he will move ahead on previous plans to persuade the San Francisco City Council to adopt the goals of the UN.

D. SWORDS TO PLOUGHSHARES AND MICHAEL BLECKER

UPDATED GENERAL REPORTS FROM ROGER EATON

A. THE APP

The app. is coming along but as usual, it is not yet ready. The good news is that it already has the goals of the United Nations built in, each as its own community making it a great tool for the nonprofit's San Francisco United Nations Goals project. There will be a messaging capability for several options, like particular communities. The app. should be ready well before the September 2025 Board of Directors meeting.

B. LIST OF PARTICIPANTS

Because of current constraints, there has been no progress on the list of potential app users. As previously discussed, the list of 100 potential participants needs to be redone. Currently, the new list consists of people who are willing to download the app when it is ready. So far, the nonprofit has 18 persons on the list out of 84 contacts, so about 20%. If the nonprofit can have 100 people ready to go when the app is up and running, that would be great. As mentioned, the app itself is great, so once it is ready Roger Eaton thinks the nonprofit can use the list and utilize the \$1,200 that Browyn Galloway donated to get the word out.

C. UNITED NATIONS ASSOCIATION - SAN FRANCISCO (UNA-SF) AND THE SAN FRANCISCO UN GOALS PROJECT

As previously discussed, with respect to the UNA-SF goals project, the nonprofit needs to get the San Francisco City Council to adopt the United Nations goals. Roger Eaton has made progress by getting to know the new UNA-SF President Ashley Reveche a little better. Lately, he has been attending UNA-SF meetings. He will wait on approaching San Francisco County Supervisors until the app is up and ready for use.

A. THE APP

The App. is coming along, however, it is still not ready to go. It will soon have the goals of the United Nations built in, each with its own community making it a great tool for the nonprofit's San Francisco United Nations goals project. As of today, the App. looks to be ready in February/March, 2025.

B. LIST OF PARTICIPANTS

The list of 100 potential participants needs to be redone. Currently, the new list consists of people who are willing to download the App. when it is ready. So far, the nonprofit has 18 persons on the list out of 84 contacts, so about 20%. If the nonprofit can have 100 people ready to go when the App. is up and running. So far, Roger Eaton has been using a large list of the United Religions Initiative Members as the list of potential contacts.

C. UNITED NATIONS ASSOCIATION - SAN FRANCISCO (UNA-SF) AND THE SAN FRANCISCO UN GOALS PROJECT

As previously discussed, with respect to the UNA-SF goals project, the nonprofit needs to get the San Francisco City Council to adopt the United Nations goals. Roger Eaton has made progress by getting to know the new UNA-SF President Ashley Reveche a little better. Ms. Reveche has suggested to Roger Eaton that for City Council outreach purposes, he should seek a Supervisor willing to put the nonprofit's project on the Council's docket. This is easier said than done, as the Council had to first, have the November election to elect half of the Council and second, proceed with the 2024 holidays. Currently, Roger Eaton has decided to continue becoming better acquainted with the UNA-SF chapter and then wait on approaching Supervisors until the nonprofit's App. is ready.

Furthermore, Roger Eaton will look into contacting the newly elected San Francisco Mayor, Daniel Lurie to discuss the resolution to bring the goals of the UN home to San Francisco. These goals may interest Mayor Lurie in three ways, 1). politically, as it is a way to take a jab at Trump without mentioning his name, 2). morally, as it is a way for San Francisco to take action on serious global issues and, 3). practically, as it will help San Francisco City Hall to coordinate its actions better.

D. SWORDS TO PLOUGHSHARES

Recently, a veteran friend of Roger Eaton who lives in the Parkmerced complex suggested to him that he reach out to U.S. Army veteran Michael Blecker, previously Executive Director and currently Executive Director Emeritus of Swords to Ploughshares, a San Francisco veterans organization.

He thinks that Michael Blecker would be a perfect organizer/fundraiser for the nonprofit. Roger Eaton will make contacting Michael Blecker a top priority on his agenda as soon as the nonprofit's App. is ready.

By way of background, Michael Blecker is a U.S. Army veteran with combat infantry service in Vietnam, Michael Blecker joined Swords to Plowshares in 1976 as a Legal Intern to help his peers access VA benefits. In 1982, he became Executive Director, and under his leadership, Swords' annual budget grew from \$75,000 to more than \$30 million. Michael Blecker has a nationwide reputation for dedicated service to his fellow veterans and is a powerful authority on veterans' services and rights. He co-founded the National Coalition for Homeless Veterans and the California Association of Veteran Service Agencies. From 2002-2007, he served on the VA Advisory Committee on Homeless Veterans. During his career, he has also served on the Congressional Commission on Service Members, the California Senate Commission on Homeless Veterans, the San Francisco Mayor's Homeless Planning Committee, the National Agent Orange Settlement Advisory Board, the Agent Orange Information Center, and the Veterans Speakers Alliance. In 2015, Michael was appointed by Speaker Pelosi to serve on the federal Commission on Care, examining veterans' access to VA care. Michael Blecker holds a J.D. from New College of California School of Law and a bachelor's degree from UC Berkeley. In 2024, after 42 years as Executive Director, Michael Blecker transitioned to an emeritus role, focusing on advocacy and policy efforts to end veteran homelessness nationwide.

The Board of Directors agreed that when the time comes, Bronwyn Galloway's \$1,200 donation to the nonprofit will be used to help with outreach matters once Michael Blecker comes on board as an advocate to assist the nonprofit.

CORPORATE GOVERNANCE MATTERS

VOICES OF HUMANITY (VoH) - UNITED RELIGIONS INITIATIVE (URI)

Voices of Humanity is in a Cooperation Circle ("CC") with URI. Early this Spring, Roger Eaton spent some time making sure that CC is confirmed as active by nominating Jahangir Piara for a URI Trusteeship. At the next BOD meeting on September 12, 2024, Roger Eaton will report on whether Mr. Piara was accepted to the post effective September 1, 2024.

In addition, Roger Eaton also assisted Dr. Siderff maintain his URI CC. This is important because the nonprofit is designed to support peace between the religions as well as peace between the nations.

CURRENT EVENTS

Recently, Roger Eaton posted an article on VoH detailing how the Israeli destruction of Gaza with the support of the United States adds up to be a genocide. The current wave of campus protest is the sort of nonviolent action that VoH will likely generate if the nonprofit can get off the ground and go global.

BOD STATUS CHECK

Roger Eaton posed the question of where the nonprofit's BOD is on the same page regarding the Gaza situation.

A discussion ensued and while there was much disagreement, certain members of the Board agreed to disagree on certain issues pertaining to the Israeli/Gaza conflict.

THE APP

The non-profit needs an App if it is to get anywhere. Realistically, it will be at least until April 2024 before it is ready to go. For now, the non-profit should concentrate on using the App to get VoH off the ground. Once that is ready, then the non-profit will revisit its SF UN Goals program.

SMILE/SCOWL FORMAT

The Smile/Scowl format will be added to the App, so that one can easily switch back and forth from the full VoH App to the Smile/Scowl format. This should be relatively easy for Flemming to do and it adds a fun dimension to the project besides giving nuclear disarmament the focus it needs. See https://voh.intermix.org/nuclear_disarm.

VOICES OF HUMANITY (VoH) NODES

Back in December, Roger Eaton explored the possibility of a simple network of VoH nodes with Flemming. Roger and Flemming discussed if it was possible to give major organizations, such as SPUR.org, their own node, which would allow them to be more open to participating since they would not have to share their user's emails. But alas, it was clear from Flemming's analysis that the project would require major funding (about \$500,000) and a strong team of programmers.

Another example given by Roger Eaton was that Actionnetwork.org provides a way of putting people together into groups and emailing them. It is relatively cheap, about \$10.00 a month for the first month then, thereafter, it increases per email.

As Roger Eaton has reported, now that more time has opened up and with Flemming diligently working on getting the App up to speed these past four months, he recommends that the nonprofit continue full speed ahead.
